

Jeff Kloha

Born in Chicago, while a young child he moved with his family as his father, a Lutheran elementary school principal, accepted calls to the New York City area and Detroit before returning to Chicago. After completing studies at Concordia Seminary he served Gethsemane Lutheran Church in Lakewood (Cleveland), Ohio from 1993-99, after which he returned to Concordia Seminary. Studies at the University of Leeds began shortly thereafter, with his PhD thesis accepted in 2006. In addition to his teaching responsibilities, he serves as the seminary's Director of Theological Resources and Continuing Education.

His areas of research include the formation of the New Testament, specifically its text and canonical development within the context of early church history. He has published several articles on the text of the Pauline Letters, ancient Gnosticism and early Christianity, and Pauline theology in Novum Testamentum, Concordia Theological Quarterly, and Concordia Journal and a chapter in book on New Testament textual criticism. He is currently completing a book on the text of 1 Corinthians, and, in conjunction with researchers at the University of Birmingham (UK), editing the Vetus Latina volumes of the Pauline Hauptbriefe.

Outside of the academic setting Kloha regularly speaks at pastors conferences and in congregational settings. He coaches the Concordia Seminary Division II Collegiate cycling team and is Race Director for Ghisallo Racing, a St. Louis-based competitive cycling team, for whom he races in Category 3/Masters events locally and in the Midwest. He and his wife, Susan, are raising two daughters, who fill the calendar with band events, lessons, concerts, and other teenaged-girl activities.

Randall Price

Is the Founder and President of World of the Bible Ministries, Inc. and is Distinguished Research Professor and Executive Director of the Center for Judaic Studies at Liberty University (Lynchburg, Virginia). He is also Adjunct Professor of Apologetics at Veritas Evangelical Seminary in California. He has taught at the University of Texas (Austin), The International School of Theology, Trinity Southwest University, and Criswell College. He has done post-graduate work at the Hebrew University in Jerusalem and has served as Director of Excavations on the Qumran Plateau in Israel since 2002. He has written numerous articles and contributed to the *New Eerdmans Dictionary of the Bible, Encyclopedia of Apologetics, Popular Encyclopedia of Bible Prophecy* (Harvest House), *Premillennial Dictionary of Theology, Handbook to the Book of Acts* (Kregel), and was coauthor of the *Zondervan Handbook of Biblical Archaeology*. His books include *Secrets of the Dead Sea Scrolls, Searching for the Original Bible, The Temple in Bible Prophecy, Jerusalem in Prophecy, The Stones Cry Out, Unholy War, Fast Facts on the Middle East Conflict* (Harvest House), *Charts on Bible Prophecy* (Zondervan), and a commentary on Ezekiel and Daniel in the *Popular Bible Prophecy Commentary* (Harvest House).

Personal Background

(John) Randall Price was born in San Marcos on November 19, 1951 to Elmo Churchill and Maurine Grace Price. His grandfather began the first phone company in San Marcos and the family residence was an historic home (150 years old) in the center of town across from the First United Methodist Church. He and his wife Beverlee Shaw (married for 31 years) have five children: Elisabeth (married), Eleisha (married), Erin (engaged), Jonathan (engaged), and Emilee (in college).

Academic Background

Dr. Price received his bachelor's (B.A.) from Texas State University, his master's degree (Th.M.) from Dallas Theological Seminary in Old Testament and Semitic Languages, and his doctorate (Ph.D.) from the University of Texas at Austin in Middle Eastern Studies with a concentration in Hebrew and Archaeology. He has also done graduate work in biblical and archaeological studies at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem.

Professional Background

Dr. Price has been an instructor at the University of Texas (Austin), an adjunct professor in the Department of Archaeology and Biblical History at Trinity Southwest University (Albuquerque, New Mexico), and is an adjunct professor on the faculty of the Pasche Institute of Jewish Studies connected with Criswell College in Dallas, TX. He is currently the Executive Director and Distinguished Professor of Judaic Studies at Liberty University, Lynchburg, VA.



He has been involved in archaeological excavation at Tel-Yin'am, Jerusalem, and is currently Director of excavations at the Qumran plateau (since 2002), site of the Dead Sea Scroll community, and Assistant Director of the Hyrcania tunnel excavation, in Israel. He has been a co-curator of the traveling museum exhibition: "From the Dead Sea Scrolls to the Forbidden Book" and is preparing to open the World of the Bible Museum in the future.

Dr. Price is founder and President of *World of the Bible Ministries, Inc.* (since 1993), an organization specializing in research and communication of information about the ancient and modern world of the Bible. He lectures in conferences worldwide and appears on numerous talk shows and television and radio programs as an expert on the Middle East. He has led more than 80 tours to the lands of the Bible and is a certified Christian tour guide in Israel.

Joel Lampe

As a young man in college, Joel Lampe says he "lost" the faith taught him by his father, Craig Lampe, a noted authority on old and rare Bibles.

The younger Lampe tried to find God by studying other faiths, including Judaism and Islam. He even lived in India for six months to examine Hinduism before realizing it wasn't for him.

"I could poke a thousand holes in the Resurrection, the Catholic Church, Islam and every other religious denomination," said Joel Lampe, one of the two curators of the Dead Sea Scrolls and the Forbidden Book exhibit at the Von Braun Center here through January.

"I couldn't defend my faith. I had to find it. Everyone needs to do an academic study (of religions) to learn about their faith. They (ministers) don't teach it from the pulpits because most don't know it."

In 1990, Lampe went to Israel to study the Dead Sea Scrolls and visit historical biblical sites.

As he saw sites he had only read about in the Bible, Lampe began the see Scripture in a different light. He realized they were more than just words of wisdom passed down through the ages. They were words written by real people about real events.

A couple of years later, he said, he began studying the lives of William Tyndale, John Rogers, Thomas Cranmer and John Wycliffe - biblical publishing pioneers who were persecuted or killed for challenging the authority of the Roman Catholic Church.

He also said he learned from his academic study of Jesus' disciples that, many of them experienced horrific deaths "and none even flinched."

"These were 11 guys who went 11 different directions (after the Ascension) and never saw each other again. They all told the same story and refused to deny what they saw. There had to be something to what they believed," he said.

Lampe, who lives in Phoenix, said he decided Christianity actually held the truth for him. About two years ago, he and his father's long-time friend and colleague, Lee Biondi, a noted curator of ancient manuscripts and Bibles, decided to put together a religion-related exhibit that would appeal to the masses.
