Introduction

Prayer is personal.

That's the reason I yearned to share with God my deepest hopes for our grandchildren. Being removed from the daily drama allows me to love these "grands" a bit differently. Have you experienced this, too?

Now that parenting is behind us, we find the extra money to buy a cherished toy and listen to the entire journey of a lost tooth. And that's good! Research suggests such actions convey a sense of safety, security, and belonging.



I do not cease to give thanks for you, remembering you in my prayers, that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and of revelation in the knowledge of Him.



But we can offer so much more.

Just think: Every generation learns through the family. Years ago, you and I watched our parents. We absorbed what they taught us. Then suddenly, we were parents; our children learned from us. And now? Our family story isn't finished: you and I can help shape the next generation.

For through prayer, God invites us to wrap a grandchild in the values of a Christian family. What a privilege to help shape the moral character of another generation!

Those babies who snuggled in our arms will determine their own journey through life. But don't let them leave without God's blessing: Launch them into the world on wings of prayer.

Space for journaling is provided for each prayer. When we pray for our grandchildren, my husband and I love to keep a record of the prayer moment, jotting down his/her name, the date, and any other notes that memorialize the prayer time. This simple practice helps us remember the prayers and also serves as a sweet memento of our grandchildren's youth. When they are grown, how encouraging it is to look back at these notes to be reminded of God's faithfulness!

Personalize these prayers to reflect the traditions, culture, and heritage of your family. Instill the virtues and values of your shared legacy. Cover your grandchild with love. But most of all, as a member of God's family, may your grandchild know Jesus as his/her Savior.


